Randi Fisher is a philanthropist and social entrepreneur focused on the nexus of the environment, health, and sustainability. She is co-founder and trustee of the Pisces Foundation in San Francisco. The Foundation’s vision, “people and nature thriving together,” reflects Randi’s belief that awareness of the interconnectedness between people and nature is critical to our collective future. Randi is involved in the full range of the Foundation’s work with an emphasis on its environmental education program, which seeks to prepare the next generation to make sound, sustainable decisions about health and the environment.

In addition to her work at the Foundation, Randi serves in leadership positions at a range of nonprofit organizations focused on environmental stewardship and human well-being. She is a trustee of the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy; a founding board member of Education Outside; a co-founder and advisory council member of Ten Strands; and provides strategic advice to the FOR-SITE Foundation. Randi also played a central role in founding Blue Sky Funders Forum, designed to build the environmental education field; provided critical early support to ChangeScale, a collaborative of leading Bay Area science and education organizations; and served as a trustee of the California Academy of Sciences, where the Foundation’s support is catalyzing a global environmental literacy initiative.

Randi graduated from the University of Colorado, Boulder in 1979 with a Bachelor of Art degree in Fine Arts and Psychology. In 1985, she received a Masters’ degree in Arts Administration from New York University. Randi is an avid fisherman and hiker, with a lifelong devotion to the arts.
